
3 WHEREAS, on March 15, 2019, the Supervising Juvenile Court Judge,  
4 pursuant to Welfare and Institutions Code 209 and 229, inspected Pathways  
5 Academy and found it to be a suitable place for confinement of minors,

6 WHEREAS, on March 1, 2019, the Supervising Juvenile Court Judge,  
7 pursuant to Welfare and Institutions Code 209 and 229, inspected Camp Erwin  
8 Owen and found it to be a suitable place for confinement of minors.

9 WHEREAS, on the above dates, Camp Erwin Owen, Kern Crossroads  
10 Facility, James G. Bowles Juvenile Hall, Furlough Treatment Rehabilitation, and  
11 Pathways Academy are in conformity with the minimum standards for juvenile  
12 halls, camps, and schools as outlined in Title 15 of the California Code of  
13 Regulations.

14 NOW, THEREFORE, the Court finds that as a result of the inspections and  
15 documentation provided by the Kern County Probation Department, Camp Erwin  
16 Owen, Kern Crossroads Facility, James G. Bowles Juvenile Hall, Furlough  
17 Treatment Rehabilitation, and Pathways Academy are suitable places for the  
18 confinement of minors and conform with the minimum standards for juvenile  
19 facilities and authorizes the Chief Probation Officer to certify to the Board of  
20 Corrections.
