By order of the Presiding Judge of the Juvenile Court,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED AS FOLLOWS:

I. The Court finds that release of records described below is necessary in order to facilitate the provision of wrap-around services in accordance with Welfare and Institutions Code section 18250, et seq., to children who are dependents of the court pursuant to Welfare and Institutions Code section 300, children who are wards pursuant to Welfare and Institutions Code section 602, and children who are receiving behavioral health services in the context of special education. These wrap-

1 around services are designed to build upon the strengths of the children and their  
2 families so that services tailored to the unique needs of the children can be provided,  
3 thus alleviating the need for such children to be placed in Short Term Residential  
4 Therapeutic Placements.

5 The release of the information necessary to facilitate the provision of wrap-  
6 around services will not be detrimental to the safety, protection, or physical or emotional  
7 well-being of a child who is directly or indirectly connected to a juvenile case, as the  
8 order specifically prohibits disclosure to any third parties beyond the provision of wrap-  
9 around services to the child.

10 II. Therefore, the court issues this Standing Order as follows:


11 a. Kern Behavioral Health and Recovery Services, Kern County  
12 Probation Department, Kern County Department of Human Services, Kern County  
13 Public Health, Aspiranet (Moss Beach Homes), Henrietta Weill Memorial Child  
14 Guidance Center, Clinica-Sierra Vista Behavioral Health, College Community Services,  
15 Kern County Superintendent of Schools, and Kern Regional Center are permitted to  
16 share information regarding children and families who are approved by the Kern County  
17 Special Multi-Agency Resource Team ("SMART") to receive wrap-around services  
18 pursuant to Welfare and Institutions Code Section 18250, et seq. Release of files or  
19 information which is confidential pursuant to Welfare and Institutions Code sections  
20 5328, 827, or 10850 et seq., pursuant to this Standing Order shall be considered a  
21 disclosure for purposes directly connected with the administration of public social  
22 services as that term is used in Welfare and Institution Code section 10850, and shall  
23 be considered communications between qualified professional persons in the provision  
24 of services or appropriate referrals as referenced in Welfare and Institutions Code  
25 section 5328.

1 b. Kern Behavioral Health and Recovery Services System of Care, Kern  
2 County Probation Department, Kern County Department of Human Services, Kern  
3 County Public Health, Aspiranet (Moss Beach Homes), Henrietta Weill Memorial Child  
4 Guidance Center, Clinica-Sierra Vista Behavioral Health, College Community Services,  
5 Kern County Superintendent of Schools and the Kern Regional Center are prohibited  
6 from disseminating to any third party not listed in this Standing Order, any records  
7 received pursuant to the Standing Order, without obtaining a separate and specific  
8 authorization to release information from the holder of the psychotherapist-patient  
9 privilege for the child.

10 The Court finds that release of records described below is necessary in order to  
11 facilitate the provision of wrap-around services in accordance with before the Probate  
12 Court, and to determine the best interests of children who come before the Family Court  
13 in custody, termination, and adoption proceedings, it is necessary for the Probate and  
14 Family Courts to receive all available information about each child's circumstances and  
15 best interests, including child abuse and neglect history

16 **IT IS ORDERED.**
