16	The Superior Court of California, County of Kern will start accepting the
17	electronic filing of charging documents in criminal cases filed by the Kern County
18	District Attorney's Office. Specifically, in adult criminal and juvenile justice cases, the
19	complaint, information, indictment, petition, and supporting case documents, may be
20	filed electronically.
21	The acceptance of charging documents in adult criminal cases will be effective
22	July 17, 2023. (Penal Code sections 690.5 and 959.1; Code of Civil Procedure
23	section 1010.6).
24	The acceptance of charging documents in juvenile cases (i.e. petitions) filed
25	pursuant to Welfare & Institutions Code sections 601 or 602 will be effective

July 31, 2023. (California Rules of Court (CRC), rule 2.253(b) and rule 5.522(b) and Welfare and Institutions Code (WIC), section 212.5(a)).

No other electronic filing is permitted for criminal or juvenile cases, other than charging documents. All electronically filed charging documents are subject to Local Rule 1.10. (*See also* Penal Code section 690.5; Code of Civ. Proc. section 1010.6 (a) and (e)).

The Court will allow the use of digital signatures, which shall have the same force and effect as the use of a manual signatures, if they comply with all of the requirements of Government Code section 16.5. A party who files a document containing a digital signature under this rule represents that the signer's certificate or similar verification document is maintained in the party's possession or control, and is subject to production upon request from the Court.

Pursuant to CRC, rule 1.201, it is the submitting party's responsibility to redact confidential information (social security number, caregiver's address, etc.) so that the information shall not be publicly displayed.
